





- a. Mgarr (427757) is to the (north; south; east; west) of Zebbiegh (443757).
- b. Zebbiegh is to the (south-east; south-west; north-east; north-west) of Bingemma (434757)
- c. The straight line distance from Mgarr church (429754) to il-Hotba ta` San Martin (434767) is (375 metres; 1 km 375 m.; 2 km. 375 m.; 3 km. 375 m.).
- d. Following the main roads, the distance from Mgarr church to the pumping station at Bingemma (436742) is (900 metres; 1 km. 900 m.; 2 km. 900m.; 3 km. 900 m.).
