And if they do not get their meals when they expect them, they grow sulky and refuse to work, or burst with rage, and blow up, and spread ruin and destruction all round them. So we have to wait upon them very attentively and do all that we can to keep them in a good temper. Already we find it difficult either to work or play without the machines, and a time may come when they will rule us altogether, just as we rule the animals.

And this brings me to the point at which I asked, "What do we do with all the time which the machines have saved for us, and the new energy they have given us?" On the whole, it must be admitted, we do very little. For the most part we use our time and energy to make more and better machines; but more and better machines will only give us still more time and still more energy, and what are we to do with them? The answer, I think, is that we should try to become more civilized. For the machines themselves, and the power which the machines have given us, are not civilization but aids to civilization. But you will remember that we agreed at the beginning that being civilized meant making and linking beautiful things, thinking freely, and living rightly and maintaining justice equally between man and man. Man has a better chance today to do these things than he ever had before; he has more time, more energy, less to fear and less to fight against. If he will give his time and energy which his machines have won for him to making more beautiful things, to finding out more and more about the universe, to removing the causes

Children always a soft target for the consumer goods industry, are now being aggressively wooed by television companies. The logic of course is that if you win them over, then you have a ready and steady market. This seems apparent by the influx of "kids only" entertainment channels that have been launched in India by various television networks. The latest to the game is Nickeldenn, a United States based channel that hopes to capture at least four million sitting ducks within the first week of its launch in India.

According to the general manager, the company hopes to corner at least eight million viewers in the first year out of an audience of some 22 million cable subscribers. How? Because it is loaded with entertainment programmes.

Take a quick look at the menu television channels offer: Top of the list is of course Cartoon Network that started some years ago offering popular animation serials familiar to the Indian child. As the captive audience grew, TNT increased not only the cartoon serials but also air time. Next was Toons, on air every day for almost 24 hours.

The success in this is phenomenal and others who have followed suit have decided in favour of niche programming. Discovery launched its Discovery Kids and is "checked out" by children and adults. As one parent put it, "I'd rather they (children) watch this than stick to cartoons and film songs the whole day. It is a great form of learning plus enjoyment." Her views are echoed by teenagers who view each Discovery programme with awe. Says a 15 years-old, "I find that a lot of these programmes help with my projects in school too." But one cannot underrate the importance of the Toons, an all-time favourite. Waiting in the wings is Fox Kids and Walt Disney.

The entry of major foreign networks is being considered as part of a long term investment in a market that is expected to hit the jackpot soon. Nickeldenn, for instance, has a variety of programmes - adventure, sports, science fiction, animation series, comedy as well as news and game shows - specially for children. Close behind is Fox Kids with a formidable arsenal which has a combined library of children's titles, regarded as the largest of its kind in the world.

While channels like Kermit and TNT may feel the heat with competition, there aren't any complaints. Children are more than happy to be the focus of attention.
