THEME:

The approach of the artist when making an artwork influences the 'feel' of the artwork which, in turn, affects our response to the artwork.

For example, we respond openly to the animation and spontaneity of the vigorous brush strokes in Abstract Expressionist artworks because they embody strong emotions. Other movements and artists have used a more controlled approach and our reactions may not be as emotive, but we nevertheless still have feelings about the artwork.

This paper requires you to consider the ways in which the creative process is essential in our response to the artwork.

SECTION A INTERNATIONAL ART FROM 1900 TO THE PRESENT

Question 1 is compulsory. Also answer either Question 2 or 3.

QUESTION 1

Select any TWO twentieth century international PAINTING movements of which at least one must be from after World War II. Write an essay in which you compare the works of some of the artists from these two movements, with reference to:

- The different approaches of artists in each movement towards the creative process;
- How these approaches affect our reaction to and reading of the work/s.

Refer to at least TWO works in each movement to substantiate your answer.
