Criteria for TRUE/FALSE questions:

1. If True or False is correct and there is a quote but it is wrong – 1 mark.
2. If True or False is incorrect – No marks, irrespective of quote.
3. If True or False is correct and quote is correct – 2 marks.
4. Words must be quoted from the passage and not contextualised – if True or False is correct but contextualisation is given – 1 mark.
5. If only True or False and no quote – no marks.
6. If Yes and No instead of True or False – no marks.
7. Look out for the **key phrase** in the quotation.

SECTION B : QUESTION 2**SUMMARY****Let's talk about bullying****FACTS:**

(QUOTED VERSION – LANGUAGE PENALTY FOR EACH OF THESE)	PROPER SUGGESTED ANSWER:
1. "Believe in yourself"	1. Have faith in yourself.
2. "Talk to someone you can trust."	2. Confide in a trustworthy person.
3. "If the bullying is affecting you physically, go see your doctor."	3. If the bullying causes injuries, consult your doctor.
4. "Try to stand up for yourself."	4. Attempt being assertive.
5. "Train yourself to remain calm."	5. Practise staying calm.
6. "Try to stare him down (it gives the impression of confidence)."	6. Look confident by trying to stare the bully down.
7. "Examine your body language. Act like a person with confidence."	7. Your body language must reflect confidence.

MARKING:

- Mark for seven correct facts, ONE mark for each different fact.
- Words correctly indicated earns ONE mark.
- Faultless grammar and spelling earns TWO marks.
- Mark only ONE fact per line – ignore the second. If an incorrect fact occurs first, the candidate unfortunately forfeits the mark for his second possibly correct fact.
- If given in paragraph format, treat one sentence as one fact. The candidate automatically forfeits both language marks.

PENALTIES:

- If maximum of 50 words is exceeded, no mark is allocated for length, OR if number of words isn't indicated or obviously incorrectly indicated, the candidate also forfeits the mark.
- Indicate ALL grammar, spelling and punctuation errors:
0 – 3 mistakes = 2 marks
4 – 6 mistakes = 1 mark
7 – more flaws = 0 marks
- If quotations occur, they are regarded as grammar errors – indicate with a capital Q. Notice that no additional penalty is effected for quotations: 7 quotations automatically eliminates any language mark.
