Delightful Dolphins

- 1. Dolphins are social creatures that live in the sea in groups called pods or schools of up to a dozen individuals. In places where a lot of food is found, pods join up for a short time, forming a gathering called a superpod. These gatherings can hold more than 1 000 dolphins.
- 2. Membership of a pod is not rigid and dolphins often move from one pod to another. However, they can establish strong bonds with one another. This means that they even take care of injured or sick individuals, instead of leaving them behind.
- 3. Dolphins communicate by using different clicks, whistles and other noises.
- 4. In May 2005, researchers in Australia discovered a new side to dolphin behaviour: some dolphins teach their young to use tools. The dolphins break sea-sponges off rocks to protect their snouts while they search for food. This knowledge is mostly transferred from mothers to daughters; it is a taught behaviour and is not inherited.
- 5. Dolphins are occasionally willing to approach humans and play with them in the water. Dolphins have been known to protect swimmers from sharks by swimming in circles around the shark's target. There have even been stories of dolphins fighting sharks off, although the truth of these stories is hard to establish.

How to get that dream job

Be well prepared for a job interview as it is your chance to show a potential employer what you are capable of.

Prepare for the interview by getting background knowledge of the type of company and the employer from resources such as directories, websites, newspapers, business journals and reports. Such knowledge will give you an advantage and impress employers. It will also allow you to evaluate the job offer.

Impress prospective employers by arriving in good time for the interview.

Your dress is the first aspect an interviewer notices and uses to assess your character. Consider the kind of job you have applied for so that you would know how to dress for the interview.

It is also important to be aware of the way you walk into the room, the way you sit and your hand movements, as body language gives more away about you than speech.

There are five different types of interviews: screening, selection, group, panel and stress interviews. Once you have established the type of interview, prepare for some of the common questions asked at interviews.

Often neglected is the polite follow-up letter to the interviewer to highlight certain aspects of the interview and that sets you apart from the thousands applying for the same position.




