### QUESTION 3 EDWARD ALBEE

"When I write a play, I see it and hear it as a performed piece on the stage. I know exactly what it sounds like, I know exactly what it looks like and I have some accuracy about what the play does to me as an audience..." – Edward Albee

Albee's gift for characterisation through dialogue and action is key to the success of **Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf**. Choose THREE of the characters in the play and, in each case, discuss their representation by the playwright and their impact on the audience.

### QUESTION 4 HAROLD PINTER

Pinter believes that his absurd plays reflect life more faithfully than social-realist plays, which produce the illusion that everything "makes sense". Do you agree with this opinion?

Using *The Birthday Party* as material for your essay, discuss whether you consider the play to reflect life in the twentieth century faithfully.
