If a candidate breaks any of the apparatus, or loses any of the material supplied, the matter should be rectified and a note made in the Supervisor's Report.

If arrangements are made for different sessions for different groups of candidates, care must be taken to ensure that the different groups of candidates are effectively isolated so that **no information passes** between them.

Supervisors are advised to remind candidates that **all** substances in the examination should be treated with caution. Pipette fillers and safety goggles should be used where necessary.

Instructions to Supervisors

Each candidate must be supplied with:

Question 1

- (i) Specimen labelled **W1**. An onion 'set' or similar small onion bulb approximately 4–5 cm long and 3 cm in diameter. The outer, papery scale leaves should be present.
- (ii) Specimen labelled **W2**. A disc of carrot, as fresh and young as possible, approximately 1.5 cm thick.
- (iii) scalpel.
- (iv) white tile.
- (v) iodine in potassium iodide solution, labelled 'iodine solution' and with suitable dispenser.
- (vi) Benedict's solution, labelled, with dispenser.
- (vii) Waterbath or other suitable means of heating for reducing sugar test.
- (viii) 2 test-tubes.
 - (ix) test-tube rack and test-tube holder.

Additional material for question 2.

- (i) Specimen labelled **W3**. A short piece of stem of *Selaginella*, approximately 2 cm long. If this is not available a stem of a moss that has well defined leaves or of the pondweed *Elodea* or *Egeria*. This specimen should be as fresh as possible and should be presented in a covered dish.
- (ii) an unused microscope slide.
- (iii) square cover glass/cover slip.
- (iv) piece of filter paper.
- (v) forceps.
- (vi) scissors.
- (vii) mounted needle or seeker.
- (viii) hand lens, x 10 preferably.
 - (ix) supply of water, with teat pipette.
 - (x) iodine solution (from question 1).
 - (xi) ruler, mm.
- (xii) sight of clock.
