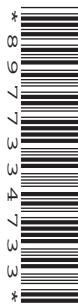

Task

Write your **report**. You must include the following:

- what the advantages are of this change
- what the disadvantages are of this change
- what the School Council recommends **and** why.

Cover all three points above **in detail**. You should make your report informative and persuasive for the Principal.
