


- 1 Ecrivez en français une composition d'environ 150 mots sur l'histoire racontée dans la série d'images suivante. Vous devez écrire au **passé**. Si vous le voulez vous pouvez imaginer que vous êtes l'un des personnages de l'histoire.



**2** Ecrivez en français une composition d'environ 150 mots sur l'un des thèmes suivants:

(a) Vous avez participé à une excursion. Ecrivez une lettre à un(e) ami(e) pour en parler.

Mentionnez: la destination; ce que vous avez aimé; un incident amusant; un problème; votre opinion de l'excursion.

(b) Vous discutez avec votre ami(e) ce que vous allez faire ensemble pendant le week-end, mais vous avez des idées différentes. Ecrivez la **conversation** entre vous deux.

Mentionnez: la proposition faite par votre ami(e); vos objections; ce que vous préférez; la réaction de l'ami(e); la décision finale.

Voici le début:

“Alors, pour ce week-end, qu'est-ce qu'on fait? ....”

Continuez la conversation.

(c) Vous étiez en voyage avec votre famille quand la voiture est tombée en panne. Racontez l'incident.

Mentionnez: votre demande de secours; l'arrivée du garagiste; ce qu'il a proposé; la suite de l'incident et votre réaction.
