(a)

Neither slumber nor sleep can seize him.

To him belongs whatever is in the heavens and whatever is in the earth.<sup>(2)</sup>

Who will intercede with him except by his leave?

He knows what is in front of them and what is behind them,

while they encompass nothing of his knowledge<sup>(3)</sup> except what he wills.

His throne extends over the heavens and the earth, and he is never weary of preserving them.<sup>(4)</sup>

He is the sublime, the supreme.

- 2 Comment on the teachings in **seven** of the following Hadiths about what Muslims should believe and how they should act. [7 x 2]

(a) إِنَّمَا الْأَعْمَالُ بِالنِّيَّاتِ

[Actions are judged by intentions.]

(b) تَفَقَّهُوا فِي الدِّينِ

[Devote yourselves to understanding religion.]

(c) الدُّنْيَا مَرْعَةٌ الْأَخْرَةَ

[The world is a cultivating ground for the hereafter.]

(d) كُلُّكُمْ رَاعٍ وَكُلُّكُمْ مَسْئُولٌ عَنْ رَعِيَّتِهِ

[Each of you is a custodian, and each of you will be held responsible for those in your care.]

(e) الْجَنَّةُ تَحْتَ أَقْدَامِ الْأُمَّهَاتِ

[Paradise is at the feet of mothers.]

(f) لِكُلِّ دَاءٍ دَوَاءٌ وَدَوَاءُ الذُّنُوبِ الْإِسْتِغْفَارُ

[For every disease there is a remedy, and the remedy for sinning is to seek forgiveness.]

(g) أَزْهَدْ فِي الدُّنْيَا: يُحِبُّكَ اللَّهُ، وَأَزْهَدْ فِي مَا عِنْدَ النَّاسِ: يُحِبُّكَ النَّاسُ

[Abstain from what is in the world, and God will love you; abstain from what people have and people will love you.]

(h) تَعَرَّفَ إِلَى اللَّهِ فِي الرَّخَاءِ يَعْرِفَكَ فِي الشَّدَّةِ

[If you acknowledge God in prosperity, he will acknowledge you in hardship.]

[Not one of you believes until he desires for his brother what he desires for himself.]

[One believer with another believer are like a building, one part strengthens another.]
