3(c)	Level 1; general advice; nothing specific; Level 2; advice regarding specific measures eg build more schools; Level 3; specific advice which takes into account the key changes in the shape of the pyramids eg education; employment; caring for elderly.	(6)

4(a)	Any four physical features; may relate to relief; drainage; climate. 4x1m	(4)
4(b)	Reserve 4m for attractions of Baluchistan eg resources; encouragement to develop by Pakistan Government; possible assistance with development of infrastruture Reserve 2m for why China; economic expansion; need for resources.	(6)
4(c)	Level 1; general observations which reflect possible negligence of an 'outsider'; Level 2; some specific observations eg damage to environment; profits go out of Pakistan; Level 3; 2 or more disadvantages presented with reasons.	(6)

8(c)	Level 1; awareness of concept of containerisation; general ideas relating to advantages and/or disadvantages. Level 2; some specific advantages & disadvantages eg speed/capacity/ unemployment/unregulated trade. Level 3; insight into both advantages and disadvantages.	(6)
8(d)	Allow references to dominance of Karachi; lack of development capital; limited hinterlands; infrastructure; appropriateness of coastal areas.	(4)
