- 3 (a) When Jesus was teaching on a level place (**NEB** level ground), what did he say about loving your enemies? [14]
- (b) Give a saying of Jesus from the cross which showed that he did not hate his enemies. [2]
- (c) Is this teaching about loving your enemies relevant today? Give reasons for your opinion. [8]
- 4 (a) Describe the meeting between Jesus and the man who lived among the tombs. [16]
- (b) Comment on anything unusual that Jesus did and said in this incident. [8]
- 5 (a) The disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray as John taught his disciples. Give the teaching that Jesus gave them on this occasion. Include the parable of the Friend at Midnight, and the teaching that followed it. [16]
- (b) What do we learn about prayer from this teaching? [8]
- 6 (a) Give the parable about the man who went on a journey hoping to be made a king, and who entrusted his money to his servants. [16]
- (b) What was Jesus teaching in this parable about

- and (ii) judgement? [8]
- 7 (a) Explain who the Sadducees were and what they believed. [6]
- (b) Describe the occasion when Jesus was questioned by the Sadducees about a woman who had married seven brothers. [15]
- (c) How does Jesus' reply show his skill in dealing with his opponents? [3]

- (i) how Jesus was mocked by the soldiers after his arrest, [3]
 - and (ii) his trial before the Jewish Council. [8]
- (b) What accusations did the Jewish authorities make against Jesus when they brought him before Pilate? [5]
- (c) Show clearly how the accusations against Jesus at the Council differed from those made to Pilate. Explain the reasons for these differences. [8]
