The Life and Teaching of Jesus as Portrayed in Luke's Gospel

Key points:

Judas led crowd of chief priests and officers of the Temple and elders. Judas kissed Jesus why betray Son of man with a kiss disciples saw what would happen – "Shall we strike with sword?" slave of High Priest had right ear cut off Jesus – no more of this/he healed him have you come out as against a robber with swords and clubs I was with you in temple – you did not take me then this is your hour and the power of darkness led him away.

 (b) Peter's denials (Luke 22:54-62) all fell asleep garden of Gethsemane, all fled arrest all disbelieved resurrection failure to understand Jesus' death and type of messiahship faithless/inability to cast out demons argument about greatest rebuked for wanting divine retribution on Samaritans rebuked for turning away mothers and their children

 stoned him

 last words of Stephen – receive my spirit/forgive them

 died – Saul witness to death
