

The soft South Wind heard the Sun's words and he blew gently towards the lake to tell the water to be as still as a looking-glass so that the Sun would see how splendid he looked on his birthday. But the sprites who live and play in lakes everywhere did not want to stay still on such a lovely day. They <u>chased</u> each other over the lake's surface and urged their friends to join in the fun. 'We will tease the sun by playing all over the water and he will not be able to see himself properly,' they laughed. (paragraph 2)

The Sun rose higher and higher until he was right above the lake. How angry he was to see that the sprites were flitting this way and that and that his own bright reflection was broken and ruffled! Suddenly he called to his Thunder Clouds and ordered them to clap with a loud noise. Then calling upon his Rain Clouds he said, 'Fall heavily on the lake to make the sprites stop dancing, and to punish them for daring to make fun of me, the King of the Skies.' (paragraph 3)

Down fell the rain, stabbing the waters of the lake and forcing the sprites to take shelter under the surface. The Sun's <u>fury</u> lasted for only a few moments, however. 'I have perhaps been too <u>hard</u> on the sprites,' he thought, 'I have spoiled their fun on this Midsummer Day. Away Thunder! Away Rain!' (paragraph 4)

Then the Sun beamed even more brightly than before. One by one the sprites
