Introduction

The teacher in charge distributes the examination papers and asks the pupils to write their name, surname and class on the front cover.

THE TEACHER TELLS THE PUPILS THAT:

1.	S/He is now going to read a story called <i>The cat called Snoopy</i> . They are to listen carefully as s/he reads. They are not to answer the questions or to write anything whilst the teacher is reading.	(3 minutes)
2.	They are to open the exam paper and to look at the questions as they listen to her/him read the questions to them once.	(3 minutes)
3.	They are to close the exam paper and to listen carefully to her/him as s/he reads the passage a second time. They are not to answer the questions or to write anything whilst the teacher is reading.	(3 minutes)
4.	They are to answer the questions in numbers 1 to 10 by putting a tick in a box to show the correct answer and in number 11 a to f, to show whether each sentence is True or False.	(5 minutes)
5.	S/He is going to read the passage for the third time. They may complete any unanswered questions as the teacher reads.	(3 minutes)
6.	They are now going to check their answers and complete any unanswered questions and make sure they have ticked only one box for each question.	(3 minutes)




