A Sly Cat

StudentBounts.com The next-door neighbour, old Mr Parkin, was going away for a week's holiday. Too parents offered to feed his cat, Ginger, while he was away. Mr Parkins gave Tod's mother his back-door key, so that they could give the cat food everyday. (paragraph 1)



Ginger was a big cat, yellowy brown all over except for one white front leg. He was rather a silent cat. He never miaowed; but he purred when he was tickled behind the ear. He liked to be out of doors most of the time. (paragraph 2)

In the evenings Tod's mother went to give Ginger his supper and every morning Tod went with his father to give Ginger his breakfast. One morning, almost at the end of Mr Parkin's week away from home, Tod went as usual with his father, but Ginger was not waiting at Mr Parker's back door. 'Ginger! Ginger!' they both called and called, but no cat came. (paragraph 3)

Ginger did not even turn up for his supper. They searched Mr Parkin's garden shed and his greenhouse. They looked in everywhere, except inside his house. Mr Parkin had left the door between the kitchen and the rest of the house shut so that Ginger could not go wandering off through the other rooms. Ginger was not anywhere. They began to feel anxious. (paragraph 4)

The next morning Tod wandered round their garden, calling, 'Ginger, where are you?' Ginger, come home!' The previous day they had looked into their own garden shed quickly, but now he wanted to look again more thoroughly all round: at the workbench under the window, and at the cupboard at the far end, where his father kept his special tools. At the bottom of the cupboard the door fitted badly and left a gap. Tod saw something white through the gap. It was a white furry leg. Tod called his mother and she came. She unbolted the door of the cupboard and opened it, and out stalked Ginger! The cat did not want to be stroked or even tickled behind his ear. He went straight to his garden and they went round to his back door to feed him.

Later, Tod's father heard all about how Tod had found Ginger in the tool cupboard. 'What a sly cat!' he said. 'Yes, I remember going to that cupboard to get a tool on the very day he disappeared. I left the cupboard door open for just a few minutes, while I did something at the workbench. He must have slipped in, while my back was turned.' (paragraph 6)

'Cats are like that,' said Tod's mother. 'I think Tod should tell the whole story when Mr Parkin rings. After all, he found Ginger. He is **the hero** of our desperate search.'
