

2011 Contemporary Social Studies Standard Grade – Foundation Finalised Marking Instructions

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General comments – Markers are advised that they should make every possible attempt to look beyond the poor handwriting and poor expression which can be expected to characterise many of the responses at this level. If the intention of the candidate is obvious to the Marker, credit should be awarded, either full or partial. Where the term 'partial credit' is used in the following marking instructions, it simply means half-marks. The term 'direct lift' refers to the verbatim lifting of wording provided in the source. This should not be penalised at this level, even if a candidate has lifted a quote in the first person. Likewise, one word answers should not *per se* be penalised. If a more extended response is necessary, the answer will be self-penalising.

Allocation of marks for evaluating questions
