The Extraneous Rule λe

Extraneous Material

Extraneous material may be penalised, depending on whether the extra information is insufficient or wrong.

The maximum deduction per question/sub-question for extraneous material is 1 point. To indicate such a penalty, cross one of the ticks awarded and put an **e** beside it:
