





Diagram Q3B: Weather Station Symbols




Diagram Q4C: Forest Camp of Baka People, Congo

Diagram Q4D: Hardwood logs ready for export by river in Madagascar



5. Diagram Q5: Sphere of Influence Model






7. Diagram Q7: Proposed Victoria and Albert Museum, Dundee




