<p>(b) On which day is the market closed?</p> <p>1 point</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sunday</li> </ul>		<p>Mention of any other day along with "Sunday".</p>	<p>"first/second (on left)"</p>

<p>(b) What does he ask you for?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• (A/my/your/parents') phone number</li> </ul>	<b>1 point</b>

Give details. <b>2 points</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It's a dvd (of the city/town)</li> <li>• <u>It has/there are/it shows/with</u> all the main attractions/it has all the attractions/it has the main attractions</li> </ul> <p><b>OR</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <u>it has/there are/it shows/with</u> parks, monuments and museums (any 2 examples) (accept singulars)</li> </ul> <p>NB: No EI rule for this point.</p>	<p>“a book/a map”</p>
