
Union membership in Great Britain

There are over 6·7 million union members in GB today. This is a 42% decrease from 1979 which was the peak year for union membership when there were 13·2 million union members. Membership is projected to decrease further in the future. In the past, union membership was strong in the traditional industries of mining, quarrying and the utilities such as gas, electricity and water.




Trade union membership - ethnicity and gender



Information about Dunelder and The Technology Park



Dunelder is a town of 42,000 people in the South West of Scotland. Two years ago, Dunelder Council decided to build a technology park to attract new employment into the town. Only one site remains vacant, and to encourage businesses to consider setting-up there a package of financial help is available as follows:

Year 1 - £1.5 million Year 2 - £1.0 million Year 3 - £1.0 million Year 4 - £0.5 million

- In recent years the town has suffered from high unemployment due to the closure of two large local factories. As a result, there are many people available for work, but they are mainly low-skilled.
- There are 3 companies already in the technology park. One is a computer firm specialising in producing software programmes. Of the remaining two, one produces solar heating panels and the other produces blades for wind turbines, both important types of renewable energy.
- There are 8 primary schools and 2 secondary schools in the town. The local council has spent a lot of money on these, and all now provide an excellent education. There is no university nearby, but the town does have a college which specialises in agriculture.
- Shopping and leisure facilities in the area are generally good. There are 3 supermarkets and the town centre has several traffic free shopping streets. There is a multi-screen cinema, several restaurants and 2 golf courses locally. A new development of luxury homes has recently been completed 3 miles outside of town. These are available at reduced prices due to the recent economic difficulties.

Statements from the owner of Wave Power Systems

My company makes special equipment that produces electricity from the action of waves in the sea. Our factory will need access to the sea to allow us to test and transport our products.

The new factory will have a sport and fitness centre for employees. This will also be open to local residents, which will help improve the town's exercise levels.

Wave Power Systems is a world leader in the renewable energy field. Close links with a nearby university, to help our research, would be very important to our future success.

The factory in Dunelder would include a research centre. To achieve this we would need the cooperation of at least 2 other local companies involved in renewable energy.

The site should go to my company because people in the local area agree that renewable energy is the most important way of improving the environment.

SOURCE 2

Statements from the owner of Earth Save Insulation

My company will create 150 new jobs, most of which will be suitable for people with only basic skills. We will train them for the job we want them to do.

The factory will create a lot of excess heat. We will make this available to heat any new houses that are being built nearby. This will be good for the environment and local people.

To meet the costs of a new factory, my company would need at least £5 million in financial assistance within the first 5 years.

A management team will be moving into the Dunelder area to start up the factory. They will only move if the area has affordable good quality housing.





Education—How well is Africa shaping up?

UNESCO is promising to help African countries through its "Literacy Decade" campaign. However, it points out that Africa has a long way to go, as one fifth of African adults are illiterate.

The economic crisis in Zimbabwe has had an effect on the education budget in recent years. They cannot find enough qualified teachers to work in their schools.

The government of Lesotho has shown a commitment to education. They spent 13% of their GDP on schooling in 2008 whilst in 2003, it was 11%. This has had a positive effect on literacy rates.

In Botswana, literacy rates have changed from 80% to 84% since 2003. Every child in Botswana can expect to go to school for twelve years. Swaziland, a country badly affected by HIV/Aids, has seen literacy rates go from 74% in 2003 to 81% in 2008. The situation in Ethiopia mirrors much of Africa with literacy levels going up although they are still low when compared to developed countries.
