



MPs' Expenses Row

MPs are paid a salary but are also allowed to claim money to cover expenses. For example, in 2009, they could claim £24,000 so that they could afford to live in London and over £100,000 to pay for office staff.

In 2009, The Daily Telegraph published a story about MPs' expenses. Amongst other things, the newspaper revealed that two MPs had broken the rules by claiming money for houses they no longer owned.

However, most MPs showed that they could only do their job properly because they received these expenses.

Information about Bill Laird and his needs


Bill is 80 years old, and lives alone in a big house in the town of Craigloch. He is keen to move to a smaller house.



SOURCE 1

Low Pay and Ethnic Groups

Whites are the largest ethnic group in the UK. There are big variations in pay between the various ethnic groups. For example, more than half of people from the Bangladeshi and Pakistani communities are in low paid employment. The percentage of people on low pay from an Indian background is 28% whilst for Whites it is 20%. The figure for Black Africans is 46% whilst for Black Caribbeans it is 30%.



Between 2000 and 2010, the American people saw the biggest change in unemployment for many years. In 2000, the figure was 4.0% while in 2010, it was 10.0%. One of the effects of unemployment was that many Americans lost their houses as they could not afford to pay for them.

In 2009, President Obama signed the "American Recovery and Reinvestment Act", which was a plan to spend \$539 billion to help the country recover. The government believes that these measures have already helped the economy to improve as the number of companies closing down has fallen.







Since the world recession, around 20 million rural migrants have returned home to the countryside. There are no longer jobs for them in China's coastal cities. However, it is not only migrant workers who are struggling to find jobs. In China, 32% of the 6·11 million graduates have not yet found work. The Chinese Government has promised to do what it can to tackle the problem of unemployment. It is planning to spend \$585 billion to try to help the country's economy recover.



The War in Afghanistan (2009)

VIEW OF LYNSEY LEWIS

When the International Security Assistance Force (ISAF), backed by NATO, was sent to Afghanistan, it was NATO's first operation outside Europe.

As of October 2009, ISAF had 67,700 troops from 42 different countries in Afghanistan. The largest contributing nations are the USA with 32,000 troops and the UK with 9000 troops.

NATO has brought peace and stability to the government of Afghanistan. It is also involved in training the Afghan National Army.

It is hoped that in the near future much of the Taleban's funding which comes from the trade in heroin will stop as ISAF takes back the areas where the illegal production of heroin is based.

VIEW OF KIRSTY GRAHAM

The number of ISAF troops has grown from 5000 to almost 68,000. This International Security Assistance Force is the first time NATO has sent combat troops outside Europe.

Although many NATO members have sent equipment to help, only a few countries have sent troops.

The UK and the USA remain the largest contributors of troops. Some of these troops are training the Afghan army to fight the Taleban. So far, NATO hasn't managed to stop the Taleban's civil war against the Afghan Government.

One of the main sources of income for the Taleban is the trade in heroin. The Taleban control much of the territory where the heroin is produced.

Sources 1 and 2 give different views about NATO's forces in Afghanistan.
