Information about Gleninch Council and the needs of lone parents

Gleninch Council is concerned that lone parents are struggling to return to work. They have decided to fund one project to help this group. The main aims of Gleninch Council to help lone parents are:

- to provide access to good quality childcare
- to improve ICT skills
- to develop better interview skills.

Gleninch Council is not sure if **Project A** or **Project B** would best meet its aims.

PROJECT A

Gleninch has a high rate of unemployment amongst lone parents.

This project would focus on teaching parents ICT skills to enable them to return to a modern workplace. They would be shown how to word process, e-mail and access the Internet.

Accommodation at Gleninch College is available and the project could be up and running within six months.

This project would have a free nursery to allow the parents to concentrate on learning their new skills.

PROJECT B

There are jobs in Gleninch but many people do not have the skills needed to get into work.

This project would provide parents with an allowance to cover nursery costs so that they could attend the course.

The main focus in this project would be communication skills to improve interview technique. The parents would role play interviews and practise answering questions.

Gleninch College will provide accommodation and a Gleninch teacher has volunteered to teach the course.

Youth Unemployment

Many young people have been leaving school with no job or college place to go to. This group is sometimes referred to as "NEETs". This stands for "Not in Employment, Education or Training". This problem is worst in poor areas already suffering from high levels of unemployment.

In 2010, the unemployment rate among under 25 year olds was more than double that of any other age group. Almost 8% of 18–24 year olds were unemployed compared to only 3% of 50 year olds.







In 2010, 45 million people had no health insurance. If the Government did nothing, this figure would be 53 million by 2020. To stop this happening, President Obama working with Congress passed a new health law that brought down health care costs for American families and small businesses. Much stricter rules were put in place for health insurance companies.

Millions of Americans took a step closer to achieving the American Dream as a result of President Obama's health reforms. He hoped that the reforms would lead to an increase in life expectancy whilst child death rates would fall. America spends 16% of its annual income on health while the UK and France spend 8%.





Chinese Health — The Government's New Plan

By 2020, the Chinese Government has promised to provide "safe and affordable health services" to all Chinese people. At the moment, the average Chinese person pays around half of their medical bills themselves. Currently, 43% of Chinese people are not satisfied with the quality of healthcare they receive.

Most Chinese people live in countryside areas where standards of health are poor. In the countryside, 76% of people are concerned about paying medical bills while in towns, 58% are worried. Under the Government's new plan, almost 30,000 Rural Township Hospitals are to be built and more than 1 million village and community doctors are to be trained.







TIMELINE AFGHANISTAN KEY EVENTS 2003 – 2011

DATE	EVENT
2003	NATO takes control of security in the Afghan capital, Kabul. It is NATO's first-ever mission outside of Europe.
2004	Al-Qaeda attempt to assassinate the new President of Afghanistan.
2005	The first parliamentary elections in more than 30 years are held. Hamid Karzai is declared the new President of Afghanistan.
2006	International donors promise more than £5.7 billion in reconstruction aid over 5 years. NATO takes responsibility for security across the whole of Afghanistan.
2007	NATO troops, together with Afghan forces, launch "Operation Achilles" which is the largest offensive to date against the Taliban.
2008	NATO leaders say the peacekeeping mission in Afghanistan is their top priority. They promise to stay and help the Afghan Government for as long as they are needed.
2009	The USA sends an extra 4000 troops to train the Afghan army and police. More than 100 tonnes of drugs is seized by coalition forces.
2010	NATO-led forces launch a major offensive in a bid to secure Government control of more of Afghanistan. The NATO focus in Afghanistan is now to protect civilians.
2011	Coalition forces suffer further casualties from Taliban attacks. Troops from the US and UK are most affected.

NATO has been increasing its troops in the Afghan conflict. Afghanistan has been given very little international aid to help it rebuild cities destroyed by warfare. Unfortunately, Afghanistan has made no improvements in democracy in the country. The Taliban continues to target coalition troops.
