Questions 1 to 4 are based on Sources A to C on pages 2 – 6. Answer Questions 1 to 4 before attempting Question 5.

In Questions 1 to 4 use only the Sources described in each question.

#### **Question 1**

Use only Source C1, C2 and Source A.

To what extent does the evidence support Ken Dorward?

Ken Dorward states, "However, since 2007, the number of people on low incomes has risen while the relative value of the NMW in the UK is one of the lowest in the developed world."

Source C1 shows he is **correct** as the number of people on low incomes has started to rise from 2007.

But he is **incorrect** with regard to Source C2 as the relative value of the NMW in the UK is **not** one of the lowest in the developed world. The UK lies fourth behind France, Australia and the Netherlands.

#### Question 2

Use only Source C3 and Source A.

Why might Ken Dorward be accused of exaggeration?

Ken Dorward states, "Few people believe that an £8 per hour NMW will push up wage rates in other areas of employment."

Ken exaggerates because Source C3 shows 40% of people surveyed believe a higher NMW will push up wages in other areas of employment. This is highest percentage response.

#### **Question 3**

Use only Source C4 and Source B.

Why might Christine Kelly be accused of exaggeration?

Christine Kelly states that, "The UK now has very few households living in poverty compared to other European Union countries."

Christine exaggerates because Source C4 shows UK is fourth highest in table just below Greece, Italy and Spain. UK is also above EU average.

# **Question 4**

Use only Source C3, C5 and Source B.

To what extent does the evidence support Christine Kelly?

Christine Kelly states, "Opinion surveys show that the public agree with the idea of a NMW but an £8 NMW but an £8 NMW would have a disastrous affect on a businesses such as hotels and restaurants where the majority of low paid workers are found."

Source C3 shows Christine to be **correct** as 85% of people surveyed agreed with the idea of a NMW.

Source C5 shows that she is **incorrect** as only 12% of low paid workers are found in hotels and restaurants.

**Note:** When answering questions 1 and 4 candidates must quote fully from the sources **and** provide evidence to support and oppose the view.

## **Question 5**

## **Decision Making Task or Report**

You have been asked to prepare a report for the Low Pay Commission in which you recommend or reject a proposal to increase the value of the UK's National Minimum Wage (NMW) to £8 per hour for adult workers.

- Zone Mark: C Pass = 10 or 11
   B Pass = 12 or 13
   A Pass = 14 and above
- Use the full range of marks
- Do not over-credit answers that simply paraphrase the source information in isolation
- The report must feature background knowledge to pass
- Use must be made of all specified sources

## Credit

# A style appropriate to a report (sub-headings, chapters etc) with:

- an introduction that indicates an awareness of the role to be adopted and makes a clear recommendation
- developed arguments in support of the recommendation
- identification of and comment on (rebuttal of) counter arguments
- provision and use of appropriate background knowledge
- an overall conclusion.

# **Arguments for the proposal may feature:**

- poverty levels rising; help meet poverty targets and end poverty wages
- reduce social inequalities collectivist approach
- simplified tax and benefit system
- stimulate economy
- make work 'pay' and encourage workforce to become more skilled

# **Argument against the proposal may feature:**

- harm economic recovery; hurt business relative to foreign competition
- unjustified: UK NMW relatively high
- individualist approach best way to tackle poverty and reduce inequality
- employees should be paid only what they are worth
- increase wages across employment levels

**Accept**, **but do not 'check list'**, background knowledge which may be developed from the following statements:

#### Source A

- "...government...targets to reduce poverty..."
- "...a collectivist approach..."
- "...the social problems poverty creates..."
- "...extent to which society has become more divided has become all too clear."
- "complicated and costly process of means-tested benefits could be scrapped..."
- "Many politicians believe the NMW is too low."

#### Source B

- "...worst recession in fifty years..."
- "The rates of pay for the NMW currently ensure there are no poverty wages in this country."
- "...range of benefits and government programmes to support the poorest groups in society."
- "...dependency culture..."
- "multinational companies..."
- "...UK unemployment rates are historically high..."

# Other background knowledge may include:

- Number and types of workers currently benefiting from NMW
- Year NMW introduced/details of NMW 16-17 or 18-20
- The individualist/collectivist debate
- Consequences of widening social and economic inequalities
- Extension of adult NMW to 21 year olds 2010
