A voice will help guide you through the music. This voice will be heard just before the music for each of the highlighted areas is heard. There is no voice in the third playing.

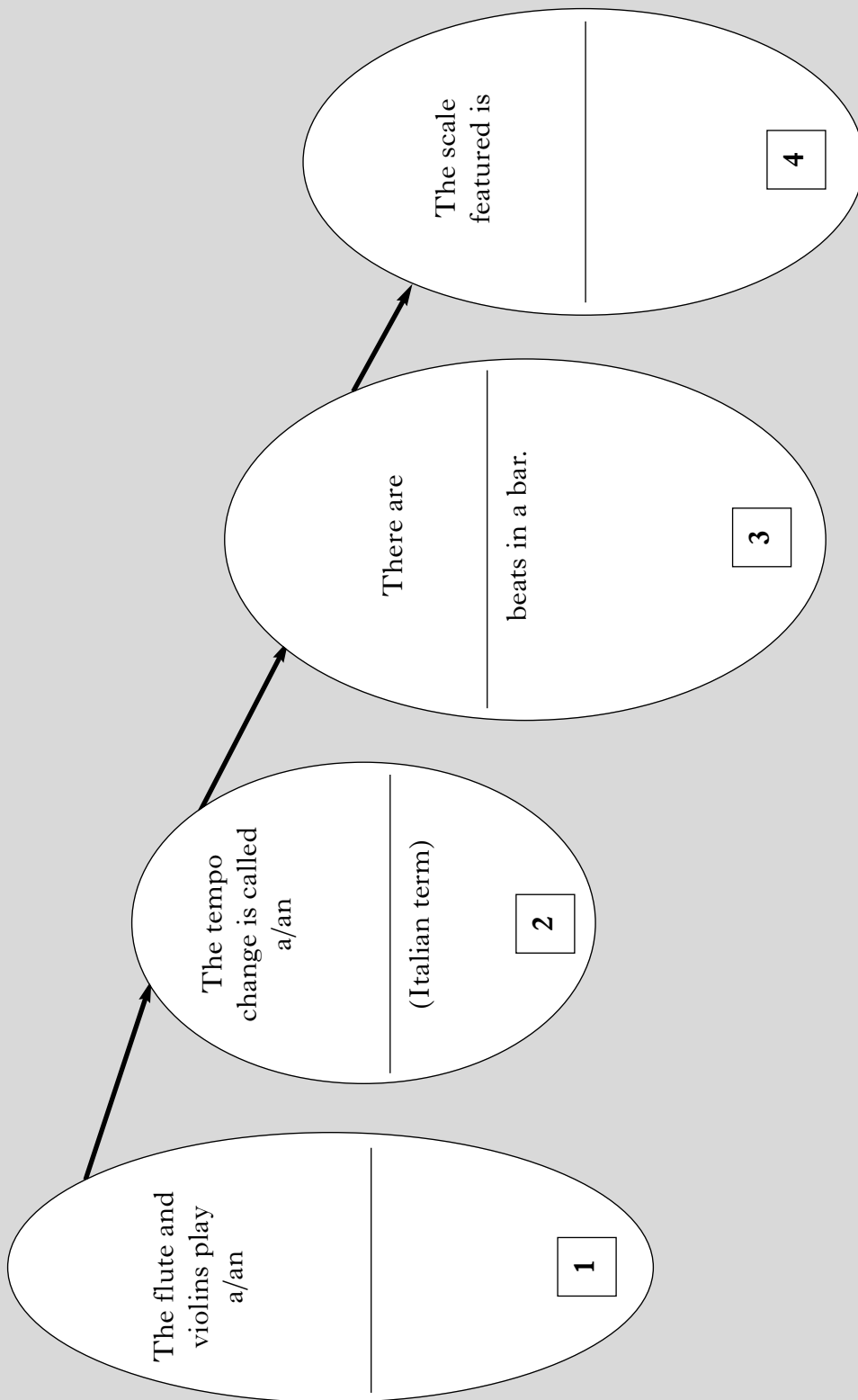
