## QUESTION 8

You are asked to compare two excerpts of music. In the column on the left of the answer pages musical concepts are listed. The number of marks listed at the foot of each column in [GRID 2] FINAL ANSWER indicates the maximum number of concepts to be identified in that column; marks will be deducted if you exceed that number.
