## QUESTION 8

You are asked to compare two excerpts of music. In the column on the left of the answer pages musical concepts are listed. You should select from that column features which are present in the excerpts, and list them in the appropriate columns (EXCERPT 1, EXCERPT 2, COMMON TO BOTH EXCERPTS). The number of marks listed at the foot of each column in [GRID 2] FINAL ANSWER indicates the maximum number of concepts to be identified in that column; marks will be deducted if you exceed that number.

Both excerpts will be played three times, with a pause of 10 seconds between playings.
