Your task is to design an application form suitable for the nursery to include in the pack. This pack will be given to parents/guardians who are seeking a nursery place for their child.



2. As part of the Scottish Executive's "Five-a-day" healthy eating initiative to encourage people to eat five portions of fruit and vegetables a day, the Social and Vocational Skills (S&VS) group at Inverfauld School has decided to set up a garden to grow vegetables in containers on the square patio outside the S&VS classroom.

The Scottish Executive will supply all the seeds and tools needed for the garden and  $\pounds 250$  towards the cost of containers, compost and a mini-greenhouse.

They have also arranged with suppliers that all purchases under the scheme by school groups will be VAT free.

 $\pounds$ 95 is available from S&VS funds.

The patio measures  $25 \text{ m}^2$  and the group has decided that to make the best use of the space they will buy the biggest greenhouse possible.

They have also decided that access paths for watering and harvesting the vegetables will take up  $8 \text{ m}^2$  of the surface area.
