Use the information on this page to complete the Financial Statement on the page opposite, showing the money they have spent (expenditure), the money they have taken in (income) and the amount of any profit or loss they have made.

- 167 tickets were sold at £1.50 each
- 83 children under 5 were admitted free
- 33 books of raffle tickets were sold at £2.00 each
- 56 individual raffle tickets were sold at 70p each

The group offered a choice of tea, coffee or orange juice and a scone with butter and jam for each person.

Based on ticket sales, the group decided to buy enough coffee for 200 cups, enough teabags for 200 cups and enough orange juice for 50 glasses from Inverfauld Supermarket.

1 jar of coffee has enough for 35 cups and each jar costs £1.75.

Teabags are sold in boxes of 40 at £2.25 per box.

Orange juice costs 98p per carton and each carton contains enough for six glasses.

4 litres of milk, sold in 2 litre bottles which cost £1.70 each.

The group also worked out that one packet of butter would be enough for 50 scones and that one jar of jam would be enough for 25 scones.

Jam costs £5.00 for a box of six jars.

Butter costs £1.75 per packet.

The group ordered 250 scones from Inverfauld Bakery at a cost of 12p each.
