





Outdoor Access Code

Help Farmers, Landowners and others to work safely and effectively—Keep a safe distance from any work and watch for signs that tell you dangerous activities are being carried out, such as tree felling or crop spraying.

You can also help by following these rules:

- 1 Leaving gates as you find them
- 2 Not blocking or obstructing an entrance or track
- 3 Looking for alternative routes before entering a field containing animals
- 4 Not feeding animals
- 5 Ask about local shooting or stalking
- 6 Not damaging fences or walls.
