After this second reading you will be given a further three minutes for a final revision of answers.

- c. 3 minutes First reading aloud of passage while students take notes
- d. 3 minutes Students may answer questions
- e. 3 minutes Second reading of passage and possibility of answering questions
- f. 3 minutes Final revision



# The most popular attraction

Dolphins and killer whales are some of the most intelligent creatures on this planet. They are also the most popular attractions in many zoos and there are special 'Dolphinariums' all over the world in places like Tokyo, Miami, Mexico City and Sidney. The dolphins, together with killer whales and seals, perform for delighted crowds. They jump into the air, play football, wear enormous glasses and even 'sing' for the public.

Many of the dolphins that go to zoos and dolphinariums are hunted in the Gulf of Mexico and the Carribbean. They are chased by boats and planes and caught in nets. Then they are not given any food until they are prepared to eat dead fish – the food they are going to eat in captivity.

Mark Petty, an animal expert, went on a hunt for dolphins and was shocked. 'It was the worst thing I have ever seen, and certainly the cruellest,' he says. 'The dolphins were frightened and exhausted. Three of them died in the nets and two more were badly injured.'






