You may take notes on the blank sheet provided during the reading. After this reading there will be a pause of another three minutes to allow you to answer some of the questions. The passage will be read a second time and you may take further notes and answer the rest of the questions. After this second reading you will be given a further three minutes for a final revision of answers.

- a. 3 minutes Teacher reads out the questions
- b. 3 minutes First reading aloud of passage while students take notes
- c. 3 minutes Students may answer questions
- d. 3 minutes Second reading of passage and possibility of answering questions
- e. 3 minutes Final revision

If you don't like flying, you are not alone. Fear of flying is one of the most common <u>phobias</u> in the world. More than 10 million British adults are afraid of flying. In America, this number is more than 25 million. Many <u>famous</u> people hate or hated flying: Ronald Reagan, Aretha Franklin, Mohammed Ali, Cher and Billy Bob Thornton are only some examples.

5 I hated flying. I knew that planes were very safe, that they were safer than cars (about 29 times safer), and the chance of being in a plane accident were about 1%. 
