The passage will be read a second time and you may take further notes and answer the rest of the questions. After this second reading you will be given a further three minutes for a final revision of answers.

- a. 3 minutes Teacher reads out the questions
- b. 3 minutes First reading aloud of passage while students take notes
- c. 3 minutes Students may answer questions
- d. 3 minutes Second reading of passage and possibility of answering questions
- e. 3 minutes Final revision

Jamaica

Jamaica is a beautiful island with fantastic weather. It has white-sand beaches and clear seas. In winter the average temperature is 23°C. In summer it's around 26°C. However, Jamaica has its problems. There is a lot of poverty and drugs, especially in Kingston.

The Jamaican national dish is ackee and saltfish. Ackee is a fruit which is red when it is ready to eat. Jamaicans like to eat it for breakfast. Jamaica is famous for other dishes like rice and peas, curried goat and roasted yams. A lot of different fruits grow in Jamaica including mangoes, grapefruit, coconut and pineapples.

Robert Nesta Marley, also known as Bob Marley, is a legend around the world and a hero in Jamaica. In the 1970s he made reggae music popular among lots of people who had never listened to it before. Some of his hits are *Redemption Song*, *Exodus* and *No Woman No Cry*. He died at the age of 36.

In 1988 the Jamaicans entered the Winter Olympics for the first time with their bobsled team. They finished 35th after a crash but everyone loved them. They showed that anything is possible because they come from a country where it never snows. Although Jamaicans have never been successful at the Winter Olympics, Jamaica has won more medals in the Summer Olympics than any other small country.
