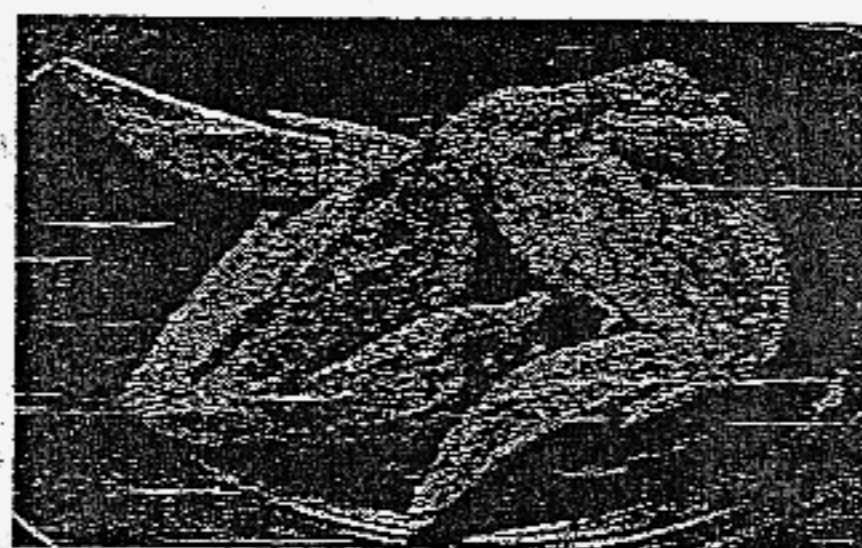

Ingredients A

- 1 kg of chicken wings
- 5 tablespoons of sesame oil
- 3 tablespoons of light sauce
- 8 tablespoons of oyster sauce
- 3 tablespoons of rice wine
- some ground pepper

Ingredients B

- 2 eggs
- some cornstarch

**Steps:**

1. Wash the chicken wings and leave them to dry by patting with a paper towel.
2. Put the chicken wings into a big bowl and add in Ingredients A. Leave the chicken wings to marinate for at least an hour. Leave them longer, if you prefer a stronger taste.
3. Break two eggs into the big bowl.
4. Heat your pan and the cooking oil over medium to low fire. Cover the pan.
5. Pour some cornstarch onto a plate. Coat the chicken wings with the cornstarch evenly and set them aside on a plate.
6. Once the pan is heated, place the chicken wings into the pan. Do this slowly and carefully to avoid splatter.
7. Fry the chicken wings for approximately four minutes each or until they turn golden brown. Ensure they are thoroughly cooked before removing them from the pan to serve.
