Ong Meng Teng, a coach driver for a travel company, toiled for months without any pay. The 51-year-old father of **two** had no choice but to survive on tips that he received from tourists. Apart from that, the travel agents paid him \$5 for every trip when they hired his coach from his employer.

Last week, Mr Ong's employer was fined \$13 000. This was the highest penalty imposed on a company to date for such an offence. Failing to pay the fine, the employer would be slapped with a \$5 000 fine and jailed for ten weeks.

When interviewed, Mr Ong said that the company was slow in paying him his salary since he started work in November 1996. As a driver, he drew a monthly basic wage of \$500 and was entitled to allowances for every trip he made.

His 23-year-old daughter and 19-year-old son, who were both still studying, had to watch their father scrimp and save whatever earnings

15 he had during those difficult twenty-two months. Fortunately justice was served and Mr Ong received his hard-earned money, all \$13 000 worth.
