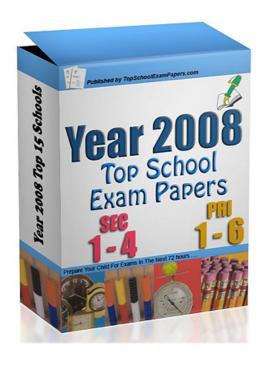

### The Straits Times, 6 January 2007

Yesterday, a swarm of bees attacked 52 people, causing panic in two separate incidents.

In one case, an elderly woman was attacked by a swarm of bees just outside the hawker centre in Zion Road at about 2pm. "She tried to swat them away with a towel but they continued their attack," said finance executive Wee Keng Hor, 39. The bees finally went away when some hawkers burned newspapers to chase them off with the smoke. The woman suffered stings on her nose, ears and mouth and was taken to the hospital.

A teacher and 16 students were taken to the National University Hospital and another 34 students to KK Women and Children's Hospital. All were discharged except four students who have been kept for observation.

The lion is often called the King of the Beasts. In many stories, the lion is shown as the king of the forest. All the other animals respect it and obey its orders. Why does it have such a **grand** title?

The chief reason is that the male lion is easily recognised by its mane. The long, plentiful hair on its head and neck makes it look very grand, like a king! A heavy mane also provides an indicator of a lion's physical health and it may also give it some protection in fights. The lion's tail ends in a hairy tuft and it is the only one in the cat family to have a tufted tail.

Another reason the lion is called the King of the Beasts is that it is one of the strongest and bravest animals. It roars very loudly and is not afraid of any other animals. Its roar can be heard up to 10 kilometres away to warn off intruders or reunite scattered pride members. No animal ever preys on the lion. Only man with his gun or spear can hunt the lion. The lion hunts large animals such as zebras and buffaloes for its food. As most of a lion's weight is made up of muscle, it is an amazing athlete. With one slap of a paw, it can knock a full-grown zebra off its feet. A lion can eat almost 50 kilogrammes of meat at one meal! When an animal is killed, the lion will eat almost every part of it — the skin, meat, intestines and even the eyeballs but it does not eat the stomach. The stomach must smell bad to lions because it often buries it. Like any good athlete, it needs its sleep and a lot of it! It can sleep up to twenty hours a day.

Although most cats live and hunt alone, the lion bands together into a group called a "pride". The territory of a pride is passed on from generation to generation and usually covers anywhere from 8 to 275 square kilometres. In the wild, lions live for around 10–14 years, while in captivity they can live over 20 years. The males can weigh as heavy as between 150-225 kilogrammes and females range from 120-150 kilogrammes.

Female baby woolly manunoth

In Northern Russia, the body of a female baby woolly mammoth has been discovered. Scientists think it is about 10,000 years old.

It is so well-preserved that it looks as if it died only a few days ago. The animal weighs 50 kilogrammes and is 1.3 metres tall.

The baby mammoth or calf was discovered by Yuri Khudi, a reindeer herder. He alerted the scientists at the nearby town of Salekhard. The baby mammoth has been nicknamed Lyuba after Mr Khudi's wife.

Northern Russia is very cold so the surface of the ground is normally frozen solid throughout the year. This is known as permafrost. It was this permafrost that has preserved Lyuba for the last 10,000 years.

Scientists do not yet know what killed Lyuba but they hope to find out. What happened to all the mammoths is still a mystery.

Lyuba is especially interesting as it died about the time at which scientists believe woolly mammoths became extinct.

There are three reasons people believed could have killed the mammoths. Some think they all died from a new type of disease. Others believe there was a sudden change in the Earth's climate. This meant that their food source - grass and other plants disappeared. Gradually, they starved to death.

The most popular reason is that they were killed by humans for their meat. Eventually, humans overhunted them and the woolly mammoths died out.

Lyuba will now be sent to Japan so the Japanese scientists can examine all the baby mammoth's internal organs. Then it will go back to St Petersburg in Russia to be studied. Eventually Lyuba will be put on display in Salekhard, the place it was found.
