



At first, the King had simply wanted to rebuild the castle that had once stood there but the more he worked on the plans, the bigger his castle became. When building works finally began, it had developed into one of the largest and loveliest castles in Germany.

It was, however, never completed, as building works stopped after King Ludwig's untimely death at just forty-one. Only the main rooms were furnished during his lifetime.

Since the king's death, millions of visitors from all around the world have visited the castle.
