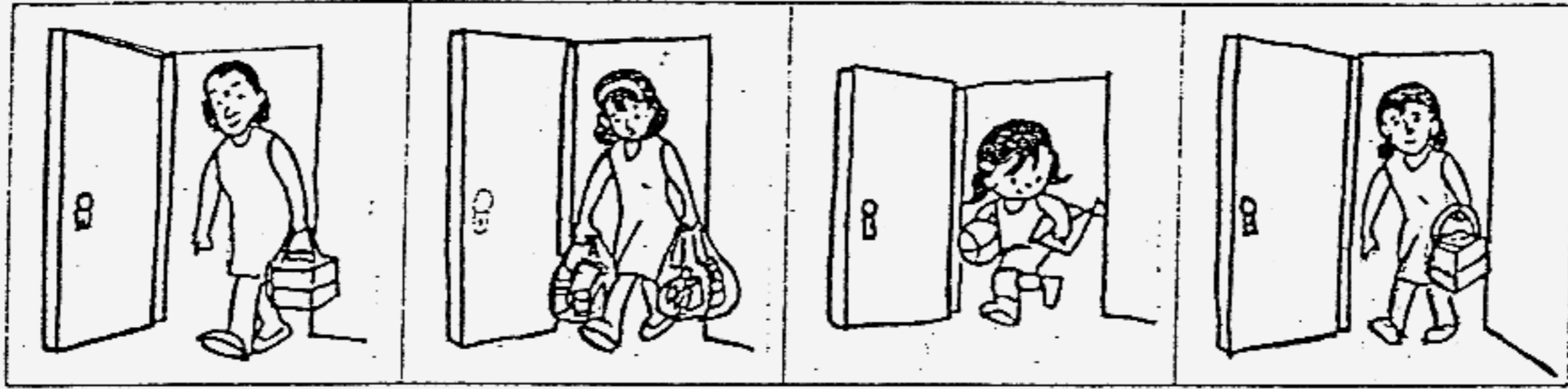

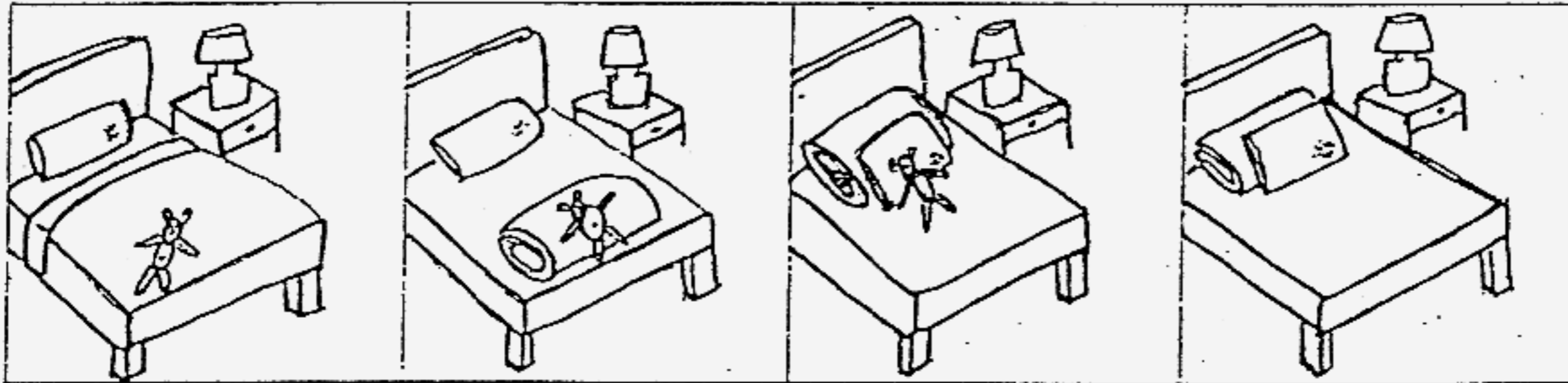

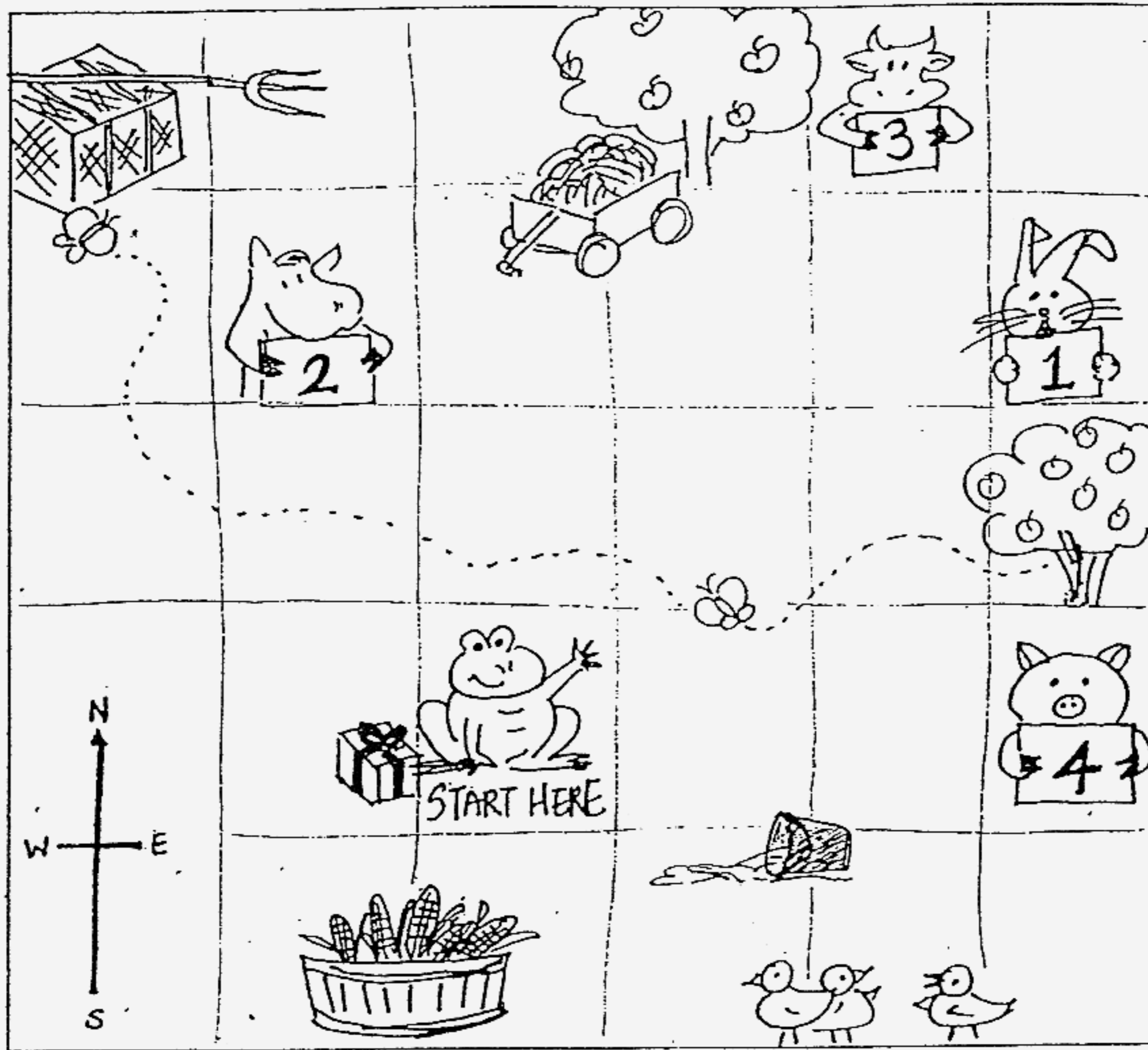

His heart was pierced by the poisonous spine of a stingray while shooting a new television programme, "Ocean's Deadliest" on the Great Barrier Reef.
