Have you ever seen a stick insect? As its name suggests, it looks like a stick. The world's longest insect is the Indonesian Giant stick insect. It can grow to a length of 33 centimetres.

Stick insects only feed on leaves. They are hunted by animals such as birds, snakes, frogs and even lizards. To avoid being eaten, stick insects have to hide. They do that by blending into the background. For example, a brown stick insect cannot be seen easily when it keeps still on a branch. This way of hiding oneself is called camouflage.

Not only the adults are camouflaged. The eggs of some stick insects are easily mistaken for tiny seeds. The eggs remain on the ground until they hatch.
