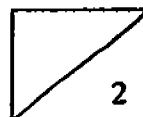

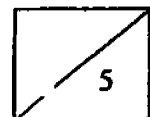

Rabbits can be kept outside or indoors as they make good house pets, being easily litter trained.

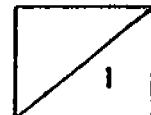

They have to spend a lot of time eating and have a digestive system that would extract maximum goodness out of what they eat. If you have a pet rabbit at home, it is the same and so its diet should consist mainly of grass and hay.

As with any pet, keeping a rabbit requires a commitment to care for it during its life which could be five to ten years or longer. The commitment required includes not only routine feeding, care and time spent with the rabbit but also the provision of veterinary treatment if the rabbit becomes ill which can be costly.

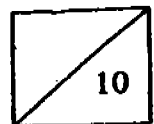
