Many of these bears were sold. The bears became so popular that Mr. Michtom thought he might need President Roosevelt's permission to use his name. He wrote to the president and sent him a "Teddy Bear". The president answered, saying that Mr. Michtom could use his name.

Mr Michtorn borrowed money so that he could make thousands of toy 15 bears. His company became the Ideal Toy Corporation. Today this is one of the biggest toy companies in the United States.
