By the sides of the wayang and along the adjacent road are food stalls selling common Chinese hawker snacks and refreshments.

At the grand opening ceremony, the stage is fully lit and the actors and actresses stream in to the clash of cymbals and take up their respective positions.

Chinese wayangs usually portray scenes from Chinese classics to the accompaniment of typical Chinese music performed by musicians plucking the 'Pipa' (the Chinese version of the violin) and piping the Chinese flute. There is also rich and beautiful stage scenery which is changed in between drops of the curtain.

Her parents engaged a teacher, Annie Sullivan, who was then nineteen, from an institution for the blind to teach Helen. The two soon became very good friends.

One day, Annie held Helen's hand under running water while tracing out the letters w-a-t-e-r onto the back of her hand. Suddenly Helen understood that water referred to the cool liquid flowing through her fingers. A new world had opened up for Helen!

Helen loved learning and she worked very hard. She learned to write using a board with grooves on it and she also learned to read Braille by tracing the raised dots on paper with her fingers. Helen graduated from Radcliffe College when she was twenty-four and she went on tours to give lectures in various parts of the world to help raise money for the blind.

Helen died at the age of eighty-eight. She was an inspiration to people who were handicapped.
