One moment she was playing at the beach with her colleagues; the next, she was doubled up in pain.

Trina Ng, 19, was enjoying an afternoon on Sentosa beach when she was bitten by a mysterious sea creature so venomous that the bite turned her toe purple within minutes. That was a week ago.

Still in hospital, her right toe remains discoloured and she is unable to walk. What bit her remained a mystery.

She told the Straits Times yesterday, "I didn't feel any pain, I just remembered stepping on something rocky and suddenly my foot was going numb."

Trina, a customer service executive, had gone to Sentosa on August 11 for a three-day Company retreat held at Rasa Sentosa Resort. At 5 p.m., she and her colleagues were on the beach, wading in knee-high water about 20 metres away from the shore.

Then she was bitten.

Her colleague, Mr Leong, 25, was standing in front of her. He said, "I could see her face change. We helped her to shore and she was dripping with blood all over the sand."

Trina was taken to Singapore General Hospital by a colleague. By then, her entire foot was numb. She was given two injections to stop the poison from spreading but by 1 a.m., she could not feel anything below her knee.

The next day, her whole leg was swollen.

"I was so frightened I would lose my toe," she said. "The doctors said that if it turned black, they would have to cut it off. They did not know what to give me as they did not know what had bitten me."

She thinks it is a stonefish, a poisonous fish camouflaged in sand.

Luckily, the strong antibiotics worked. Still, she has to stay in hospital for two more weeks, as the poison remains in her body.
