However, the response has not been good so far. Out of the thirty-three parks identified by the Board, only nine parks have found schools or other groups to help take care of them regularly, under the Adopt-A-Park Scheme.

The scheme was launched in February 2000. It aims to cultivate a sense of ownership among park users and thus a more caring attitude towards our greenery and public property. It also helps school pupils to fulfil the minimum requirement of six hours of community service a year set out in the Community Involvement Programme (CIP). This programme was started by the Ministry of Education.




