However, Jonas strongly believed that Hans should receive a proper education if he wanted to be a successful writer. So Hans went to school with little kids at the age of sixteen. It was a terrible time for him. He was often humiliated and insulted by his younger classmates and some teachers. But through it all, he never gave up his dream of becoming a writer.

After his education, Hans started writing poems and a novel. Weaving stories of magic and adventure, he soon caught the attention of several book publishers. They were intrigued because they had never published anything like them before. Immediately, these tales became very popular, especially among children.

Very soon, Hans became famous. The poor child who had suffered so much shame had finally achieved his dream through sheer will and determination. Although this acclaimed writer was *laid to rest* on August 4, 1875, he remains till today as a source of inspiration for many budding writers.

The beaver is one of the best engineers and builders in the animal world. It is able to convert a stretch of running water into a new habitat for hundreds of other wild creatures by building a dam. All beaver families work at maintaining *it* and the waterways.

One of the largest rodents in the world, the beaver is a superb swimmer but is comfortable living on land as well. Its webbed hind feet are used as paddles for swimming. The forefeet are not webbed and the beaver uses them just as we use our hands. Its powerful jaws and sharp teeth are ideal for biting and gnawing through tree branches to help it build its home called a "lodge".

The entrance to a lodge is under water, well below the ice in winter. Through the summer and autumn, it stores up food and so during the long, harsh winter, it remains warm and secure in its lodge, out of reach of prowling wolves and other hungry animals.

The beaver loves company and usually lives in pairs or groups. A number of beaver families and their lodges may be found in the same lake.

A beaver's tail is great for communicating with other beavers. Whenever the beaver senses danger, it gives an emergency signal by slapping the ground with its tail, then rushes to the water and takes shelter in the deepest part.

The beaver's mother gives birth to three or four kits at a time. It then teaches the kits which plants to eat and which trees to fell for building dams. Baby beavers live with their parents for two years or more, until they are actually driven out! Then they may travel a long way in search of a suitable site to build their own house.
