They are strong and capable of chasing and killing a fully grown pig. They have heavy jaws and sharp claws.

They were first reported in 1912 by a party of fishermen who told their friends that they had seen an island full of dragons. In 1927, two were captured and sent to London Zoo. They were christened 'Sumba' and 'Sumbawa' and housed in a very roomy, well-lighted tank planted with tropical bushes and small trees. Here they lived happily. As time passed, they became quite tame and would allow their keepers to touch them. These days, Komodo dragons can be found in many zoos around the world.

In Indonesia, these big creatures are now protected and only very seldom is permission given for expeditions to capture one or two of them.
