

# Section K: Comprehension (Open-ended) (20 marks) Read the passage below and answer questions 71 to 80.

A dreadful and fatal disease once swept over Europe in the fourteenth century.

The Great Plague or otherwise known as the Black Death first reared its ugly head in 1347. It came from China and it was carried by fleas that lived on the black rats which infested ships and warehouses. It spread quickly inland from the harbours and soon a great number of people were dying in agony. Historians estimated that over a third of the 5 population of Europe died in about three years.

Doctors could not do very much for their patients and instead, very often caught the disease themselves. It appeared that no one was safe from its grasp. However, not long after, doctors began to notice that people who kept themselves and their houses clean and avoided touching plague victims often escaped death. They realised that the plague was a contagious disease.

When this much was understood, cities like Venice made laws to keep out anyone who had been near a person suffering the plague or had been to a place where the plague was rampant. People who had any contact with the plague were banned from Venice for forty days. That was the time needed for the disease to develop from the first contact to the first signs of the disease. This practice gave us our modern word "quarantine". It was taken from the Latin word "quadraginta" meaning forty. Quarantine is a period of time which may last from a few days to several months, during which a person must be kept away from others if he or she is suspected of carrying a contagious disease.
