

London - A confidential report, received from Broadmarsh Studios, indicates that the filming of Jerry Holloway's latest movie is experiencing major problems. Movie lovers will remember that Holloway, an American who stars in the blockbuster- "Conqueror", suffered a badly broken leg last year when part of the scaffolding he was standing on gave way during filming. The accident set s the completion of the movie back by six months. That has cost the filmmakers an estimated 12 million dollars.

Now it seems that the studio is heading for more trouble, if reports from the small Spanish village where the epic is being shot are true. A French actor, who asked not to be named, said that he and others in the film were extremely 10 unhappy with their working conditions.

"Work has stopped on the set and the cast and crew have been meeting with the company for several days. We feel that we have been cheated," said the actor. "Several promises made when contracts were discussed have been ignored and the Spanish extras hired for crowd scenes are furious - even Jerry 15 Holloway has yet to receive the special conditions in his contract." Holloway, however, was not prepared to discuss this when interviewed by our reporter.

The unnamed source also claimed that several scenes had been changed at the last minute, which resulted in new background music and dialogue having to be rewritten. This means that weeks spent memorising lines had 20 been a total waste of time. "This movie set is doomed," he remarked. "To make matters worse, expensive lighting equipment has mysteriously vanished and this held up shooting for days while they transported replacement equipment from France. Then, when shooting started again, the lighting wasn't adequate and many scenes had to be re-shot."

Is human failure to blame, or is something more disturbing involved here? Professor Elpontri, a historian and an expert on ancient legends, believes that there could be mysterious forces at work. According to the professor, the historic location chosen for the movie is the exact site where the infamous conqueror made his last stand against an angry population. Several 30 archaeological fields in the area point to it as being the burial ground of the conqueror. His grave was cursed by freedom fighters. Could it simply be this curse that has beset Holloway's latest project?
