



Other than being a delicious accent to practically every dish, the unassuming mushroom is packed with more goodness than you can imagine. They are also packed with anti-ageing properties and a good dose of vitamins and minerals that are essential for the body.

And if you think they are bland, think again. Certain mushrooms can be prepared as a core snack for many dishes – from soups to stews. Mushrooms such as the expensive truffle, are highly sought after and very expensive but something of an acquired taste. Indeed, bland is the last word you would use to describe mushrooms in both the culinary and medicinal department.

Mushrooms generally contain an anti-ageing compound called DHEA. Other than a good dose of proteins, vitamins and minerals, mushrooms also contain cancer-busters and help lower cholesterol in the blood. Some also help contain allergies. Their benefits, which have been discovered through extensive research spanning several years, are, at this point, quite extensive.

Studies have shown that mushrooms are probiotic, in that they help your body strengthen itself while maintaining physiological homeostasis or the body's natural balance. The compounds have been classified as Host Defence Potentiators (HDP) which have immune system enhancement properties. This is the main reason why mushrooms are used as appendages in the treatment of cancer in the Orient, specifically, Japan and China.

Whether you know them by their Chinese or botanical names, mushrooms are health-boosting powerhouses and taste delicious in just about any meal.

Owl pellets are the leftovers of an owl's meal. Owls consume rodents, birds and insects. Unlike hawks and eagles, which tear chunks of flesh from their victims to eat, owls swallow their victims whole. The food moves down the oesophagus and enters the gizzard, an organ with a thick muscular wall. The gizzard crushes and grinds the food into small pieces for further digestion. However, bones, claws, fur and feathers are not digested. They are compressed into wet, slimy pellets and expelled through the mouth.

Owls regurgitate the pellets about twenty hours after consuming their prey. The number of pellets regurgitated is dependent on the season. During summer when nights are shorter, usually one large pellet is regurgitated. 10 However, in winter with longer nights and therefore more time for hunting, owls may expel two pellets each time, the first being a bigger one.

Owls need to dispose of indigestible food and clean up their digestive system before they can take another meal. They look rather uncomfortable when they are expelling the pellets. However, no harm is done to their 15 alimentary canal as the pellets are wet and lubricated.

By examining owl pellets, scientists are able to obtain information on the diet of the owls and the population status of their prey. If the remains of a prey species that used to be present in the pellets, are no longer found, it may be a sign that the population of that prey species is declining. Conservation efforts 20 can then be stepped up to protect that species before it is too late.
