- 1) Does criminology, sufficiently consider the interests of animals?
- 2) Critically evaluate the extent to which domestic violence is a gendered issue?
- 3) Were political and social reactions to the deaths of Gabriel Ferez and Laurent Bonomo, and Baby P proportionate and fair?
- 4) What is the nature of the relationship between mental illness and crime?
- 5) Should corporate crime and the behaviour of powerful groups receive more academic and political attention? Discuss with reference to examples.
- 6) Critically evaluate the value of the concept of 'hate crime' in understanding certain forms of deviant behaviour.
- 7) Describe and explore the complexity regarding 'sexual offending'.
- 8) Critically evaluate the social and political reactions to the 2011 riots in London.
- 9) In the context of crime and deviance, how are young people represented in political and media discourses?
- 10) What is 'institutional violence'?
- 11) Should 'war' and 'war crime' be a subject of criminological debate? Critically discuss with reference to examples.
